Govt. Notifies Standards for Mine Rescue Equipment and Medical Examination Notices

The Central Government has notified new standards under the **Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions (Central) Rules, 2026** to strengthen safety, emergency preparedness, and health monitoring in mines.

Key Provisions

- **Rescue Equipment Requirements:** Mines that do not have an on-site rescue room must maintain specified rescue apparatus and emergency equipment to ensure preparedness during accidents or emergencies.
- **Initial Medical Examination Notice:** A prescribed form has been introduced for notifying workers to undergo the mandatory initial medical examination before or during employment in mining operations.
- **Second Notice for Non-Attendance:** A standardized second notice form has been prescribed for workers who fail to attend a periodical medical examination without a reasonable cause.

Objective

- Enhance emergency response capability at mines.
- Ensure regular health monitoring of mine workers.
- Improve compliance with occupational health and safety requirements.
- Promote worker safety through timely medical examinations and rescue preparedness.

One-Line Summary

The Government has prescribed standards for rescue equipment at mines and introduced formal notice formats for initial and periodic medical examinations to strengthen mine safety, emergency preparedness, and worker health compliance.
